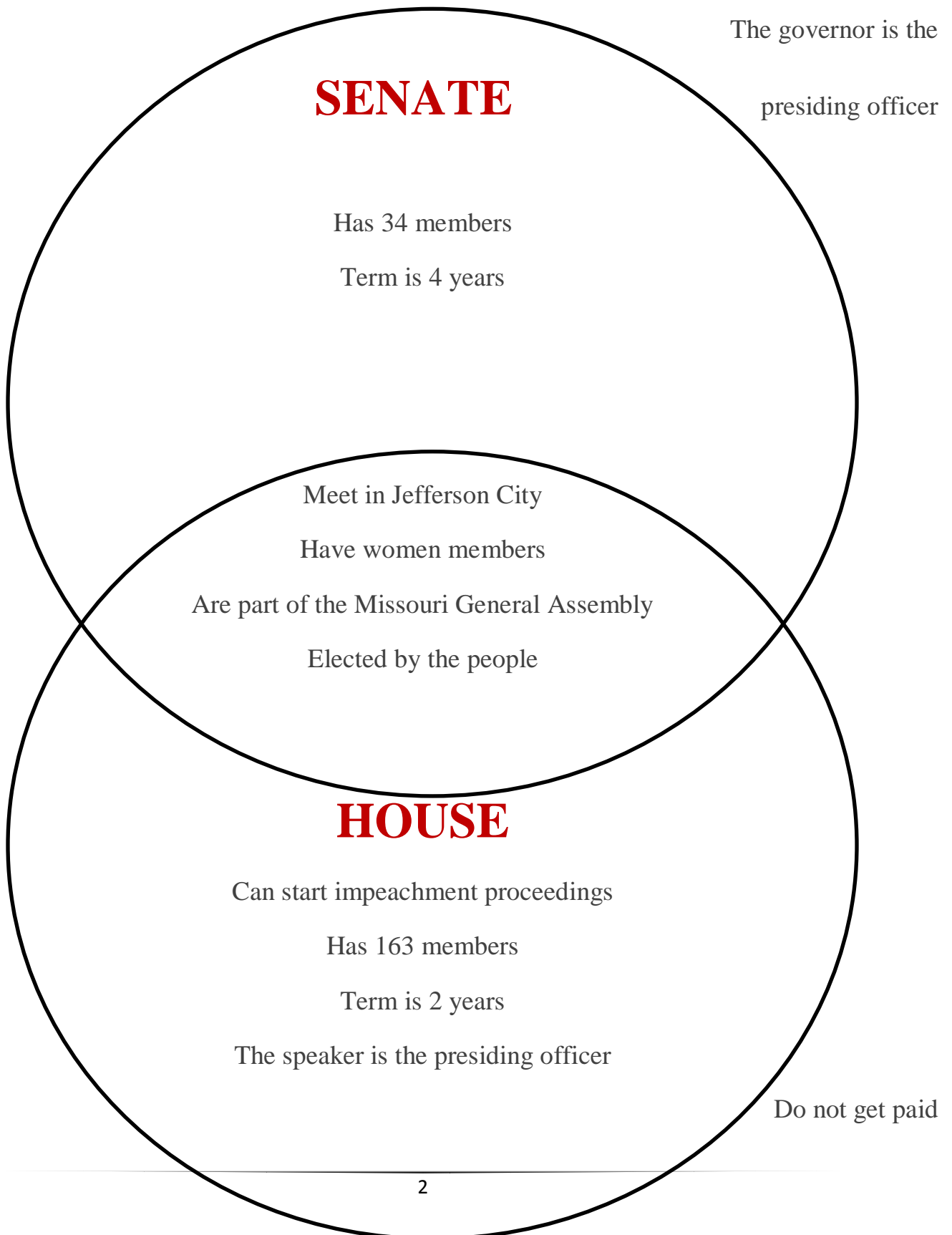

Voters must be 18 years of age or older.

There are 114 counties in Missouri.

The state of Missouri receives and spends over \$23 billion.

The Supreme Court is part of the judicial branch.

Foreign affairs is the duty of federal government.

The Supreme Court hears appeals from other courts.

Municipal courts are a division of the circuit court system, handling misdemeanors and civil matters.

The governor is allowed to use an item veto to approve only parts of a bill.

The Missouri General Assembly can be called into special session.

A governor must be 30 years of age.
